Our latest Sauvignon Blanc was carefully crafted from a blend of rare Musque and Clone 1 grapes from a single-vineyard resulting in a wine with delicate aromas of white flowers and tropical fruit with just a hint of gooseberry and grapefruit. Partial fermentation in French oak softens the acidity and lends a little more weight to the palate, supporting flavors of melon, honeysuckle, pineapple and citrus. Its vibrant acid and rich mouthfeel sees this wine drinking well now but it has structure to age gracefully for 2-4 years. Only 500 cases made of this intriguing wine.

For our Rosé we looked to the classic wines of Southern France for inspiration and created a delicious blend of Grenache and Mourvedre. This cherry-colored wine sports aromas and flavors of juicy strawberry and red raspberry fruit accented by intriguing hints of dried herbs, smoke and Grenache's signature white pepper spice. The vibrant flavors are carried through a dry finish with refreshing acidity, perfect to pair with salads, seafood and pastas or to enjoy on its own.



9 months in American &
French Oak "sur-lies"

This bottling includes a good amount of fruit from our Reserve vineyards, providing extra depth and complexity. The aromas and flavors are more exuberant than the pale gold color leads you to believe; vanilla, lemon, pineapple and coconut dominate, with hints of rosemary and limestone. Medium body and firm acidity carry the flavors throughout a long finish and pairs well with shellfish, white meats and mildly spiced Asian cuisine. Less than 500 cases of this extraordinary wine was made, so grab it while you can! It will mature like a fine Meursault over the next 2 to 5 years.



14 months in French and
American Oak

Bigger and bolder than ever, our new Cabernet Franc shows where Cab Sav got its brawn! This youthful wine has a big nose of black berries and fruit, a generous dash of oak and hints of complexity to come with more subtle aromas of smoke, tea and violets. On the palate, it's just as muscular. Prominent acid and tannins ensure a long cellar life of 8+ years, while abundant red and black fruit flavors, vanillin and cinnamon spice promise an incredible reward for your patience.

14 months in French and
American Oak

One of the finest bottlings yet, our 2004 Merlot is ripe and robust. The dense ruby wine releases an aromatic bouquet of blackberry cordial, red cherry, and dried rose petals with hints of anise and toffee that promise even more complexity with a little bottle age. The palate boasts firm tannins surrounded by generous cherry, sweet cranberry and dried fig fruit. Notes of toffee, mocha and dark plum linger over the lengthy finish and will only develop further over the next 4-10 years.



12 months in French
American Oak

It boasts a deep garnet hue, with an intense nose of red plum, raspberry and cherry licorice accented with nuances of black tea, cedar box, white pepper and toast. On the palate, the lush mouth-coating texture is echoed by the rich layers of black and red cherry, plum and berry fruit up front, kept lively by food-friendly acidity. The mid-palate brings silky tannins and hints of hibiscus, mocha, baking spices and black currant that linger throughout the finish. This wine has the framework and balance to age gracefully over the next 8 to 12 years.



24 months in French
and American Oak

Our newest bottling of *Trifecta* continues the tradition of Bordeaux-inspired elegance paired with rich Napa Valley fruit. The nose opens with aromas of classic black currant, berry and cherry, accented by nuances of cedar, cocoa and vanilla lent by French oak aging. Flavors of red cherry, rhubarb and blackberry are at the fore, set upon a solid base of toasty, spicy oak yet lifted by bright acidity that keeps the mouth-feel juicy and fresh. This wine will age gracefully over the next 12 years but can be enjoyed now, either on its own or paired with a range of dishes.
